- · Letters representing consonant sounds.
- · Some letters differentiated by just a dot.
- · Dots & dashes representing vowels
- A shva that can be either loud or silent, but doesn't look any different.

Simplicity & Wisdom

Getting rid of the decoding process & teaching the reader to discover the simplicity and wisdom in Lashon HaKodesh.



Life & Logic

Eliminating memorization by introducing the reader to the life & logic in each letter as they learn to watch each word read itself.



Lifelong Learning Success

Teaching the reader properly without measuring against grade-level standards that can severely get in the way of sustainable growth in learning past the elementary school years.

Program Overview

The K4K program consists of multiple concepts & steps that the reader progresses to on his journey to proper Kriah fluency.

Words

- The syllables, letters, and nekudos that make up a word
- The relationship of the תנועה & its תנועה

Letter Names

 Strong knowledge of the base 22 letters and their order Consistent naming of 27 אותיות shapes within 10 seconds

Letter Sounds

 The sounds that form when air is constricted and shaped at one of 5 gates of the mouth

Letter Dots

A single intuitive concept for all דגש קל
 sounds and ש\ש

Isolated Syllables

 Nekudos that show invisible properties of letters - either their movement or absence of movement

Syllables in a Word

 The basic concept of שוא explained to eliminate the need for memorizing rules

Words as a Unit

 How syllables are brought together to form single-entity words

Guided Phrases

 The main components of the trop system to guide in formation of phrases and levels of the standard pasuk structure

Anticipations

 Explanation of the most commonly found grammar rules

Pointless System

 Tools to use when reading text without nekudos

Other Scripts

- Rashi & script letters and their relationships to the original אותיות
- Foundations of Lashon Hakodesh for the English speaker
